#### Increased need and expanded services

The FOOD Pantry Serving Waukesha County continued to meet the COVID challenges head-on through the support of a visionary Board of Directors, a dedicated staff, and compassionate volunteers. State and Federal COVID programs were instrumental in providing adequate amounts and varieties of wholesome, healthy food. Continued and generous support from community donors has ensured that The FOOD Pantry has enough resources to meet the increased need. In 2022 The FOOD Pantry resumed offering indoor, full-choice shopping to clients, as well as continuing to offer drive through express, and scheduled ordering for limited contact options. This year The FOOD Pantry also expanded program offerings with the introduction of FoodShare Outreach to help our clients access other types of food assistance benefits.



### **Programs & Services**



The primary purpose of the FOOD Pantry is to distribute food to all income-eligible Waukesha County residents in need of food assistance. This year, there were 24,076 grocery visits providing food to 64,629 individuals.

#### **Grocery Distribution**

Grocery distribution was done in a low-contact, socially distanced method, outdoors for the part of the year car-side in the parking lot of The FOOD Pantry. The option of full choice shopping indoors for clients resumed in 2022.

The FOOD Pantry launched an option for guests to order ahead of time and schedule their pickups online or via phone call. With granting of a refrigerated box truck through the Hunger Relief Federation and the State of Wisconsin, The FOOD Pantry also partnered with Elmbrook School District to offer a mobile pantry delivering to 80 families each week during the school year. A new food program called the Badger Box was launched, providing local Wisconsin food products to 964 households.

#### **Food Recovery**

This program gleans quality food from various businesses that would otherwise be thrown away. The food through this program is distributed directly to The FOOD Pantry clients, as well as shared with other shelters, pantries, and meal sites in the community.

This year the Food Recovery program gathered and distributed over \$1.8 million worth of meat, dairy, produce, nuts, bakery, and other types of food.

Although the FOOD Pantry is not a government agency, it does facilitate distribution of federal food programs.

#### **Federal Food Programs**

The FOOD Pantry is a contracted agent of The Emergency Food Assistance Program or TEFAP, distributing commodity foods from the USDA to anyone who is income eligible.

The Commodity Supplemental Food Program or Stockbox is a nutrition program of the USDA designed for seniors age 60+ who are income eligible. The Stockbox is available once per month which provides about 40 pounds of shelf stable foods.

# Birthday Bags & Holiday Foods

Although not necessities, these programs are offered to clients registered at The FOOD Pantry to ensure that they can share a celebratory meal with their family.

Each year, more than 300 children receive specially packaged birthday bags with cake mix, frosting, candles, plates, napkins, and balloons. Approximately 1,500 families receive holiday food for Thanksgiving and Christmas. A typical holiday meal would include a turkey or ham and an assortment of traditional fixings.

## Infant Needs & Special Diet

These programs meet the needs of clients who, because of age or medical conditions, require special foods. For families with infants and young children ages three and under they types of products offered include diapers, wipes, formula, and baby foods.

The FOOD Pantry Serving Waukesha County provides food, hope, and dignity to county residents in need, and advocates to increase awareness of hunger through community partnerships.



We envision a future without hunger in Waukesha County.
